4. Treasurers Report

- Under GAAP accrual accounting we had a net loss of \$16,524, much less than last month’s \$76,119, and much closer to what we should expect this time of the year. This resulted in a slight decrease in equity to \$200,104 on the balance sheet. The report also shows \$398,459 in cash, a slight decrease.
- Our budget report shows a surplus of \$299,104, essentially the same as last month’s report. Recall this has to be put in the context of the "operating reserve" we agreed to earlier of \$140,000 and a Workshop reserve of \$20,000.

- The current description for Advanced Networks Software is:

Advanced Networks Software is a suite of high performance APIs and associated software for current and future HPC systems, cloud, and enterprise data centers. It is focused on applications requiring efficient networks, storage connectivity, and parallel computing.

- The OpenFabrics Alliance is actively developing and supporting the following fabric technologies:
 - Kernel-level modules to support device level applications:
 - Storage Technologies (Lustre, Scsi RDMA Protocol (SRP), MVMoF, etc).
 - Legacy Communication (Sockets).
 - User mode APIs for:
 - Parallel Message Passing (MPI, SHMEM)
 - Verbs API supporting InfiniBand-style networks
 - OpenFabrics Interfaces (OFI) providing a higher level semantic that is untethered to any particular network
 - RDMA implementations
 - Support for emerging and future networks
 - Remote Persistent Memory
